100% Fully Vaccinated!

If people wish to remain employed, within social care, they are required to be fully vaccinated by 11th November 2021. We are delighted to inform everyone that our staff team are all fully vaccinated and agree with our position that care workers have a legal 'duty of care' to keep those people we support safe and protected, from our own actions.

9% Vacancies within Social Care?

Significant numbers of care workers, within our sector, have signalled their intention to resign, following the government decision to make Covid-19 vaccinations mandatory, which could bring the total vacancies within social care to 140,000 or around 9% of the workforce. Without a clear strategy to fast track foreign workers into our sector, there will inevitably be demand and supply pressures.

The largest survey of home care providers ever conducted has found the sector is facing its worst staffing crisis in history, with thousands of vulnerable people going without care, as a result.

Some 78% of providers, who responded, said recruiting carers is the hardest it has ever been. Many describe being at "breaking point".

Due to the staffing crisis, 30% of the 843 providers surveyed said they are handing back some, or all, of their care to local authorities because they can no longer fulfil their contracts.

If we have employment vacancies and endure a third wave, or/and a stronger variant during the winter, I will do everything possible to ensure our carers, who have committed every ounce of energy over the past 18 months to supporting others, many at the detriment of their own family, are not overstretched.

Hale Place will continue to be proactive and consider all avenues for our exceptional team. We have witnessed extraordinary commitment, loyalty and dedication to our service users over the past 18 months.
